# **ABOUT THE JANUARY 19<sup>TH</sup> BRIEFING**

Older Americans—who represent a growing part of the U.S. labor force—struggle to find jobs after becoming unemployed. Recognizing the unique employment needs of older adults, Congress created the Senior Community

Service Employment Program (SCSEP) at the U.S. Department of Labor. SCSEP helps older adults find jobs and increase their economic self-sufficiency through part-time, paid internship-like training assignments at local organizations and agencies.

The one-hour briefing will review findings from a recent white paper that found SCSEP is successful in helping older adults with significant employment barriers find jobs, representing a strong return on the federal investment. The briefing will also feature first-person accounts from a former SCSEP participant, a local host agency official, and a business representative about the value of the program.
