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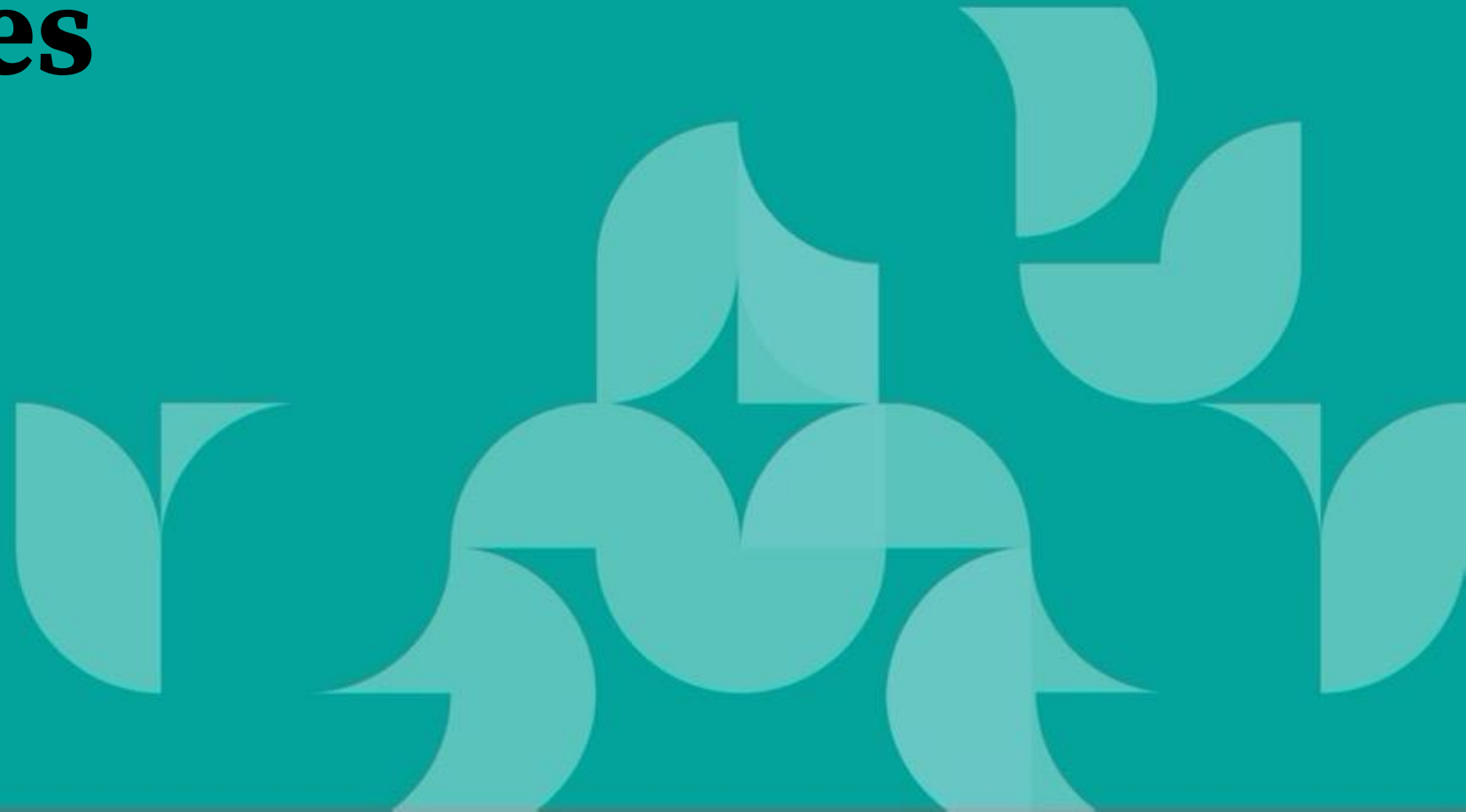

Variance Narrative Guidance


- Narrative is required for Variance of 10% or more
- Specify the budget category and variance amount
- Share why the variance occurred
 - Examples include
 - Change in scope
 - Underestimation/ overestimation in the original budget
 - Delays in Spending or Unexpected Savings
- Describe the implication of the variance on the overall project
 - Did it affect other areas?
 - Did it require reallocation or correction?

If you had a variance of 10% or more in any expense category, please explain below.

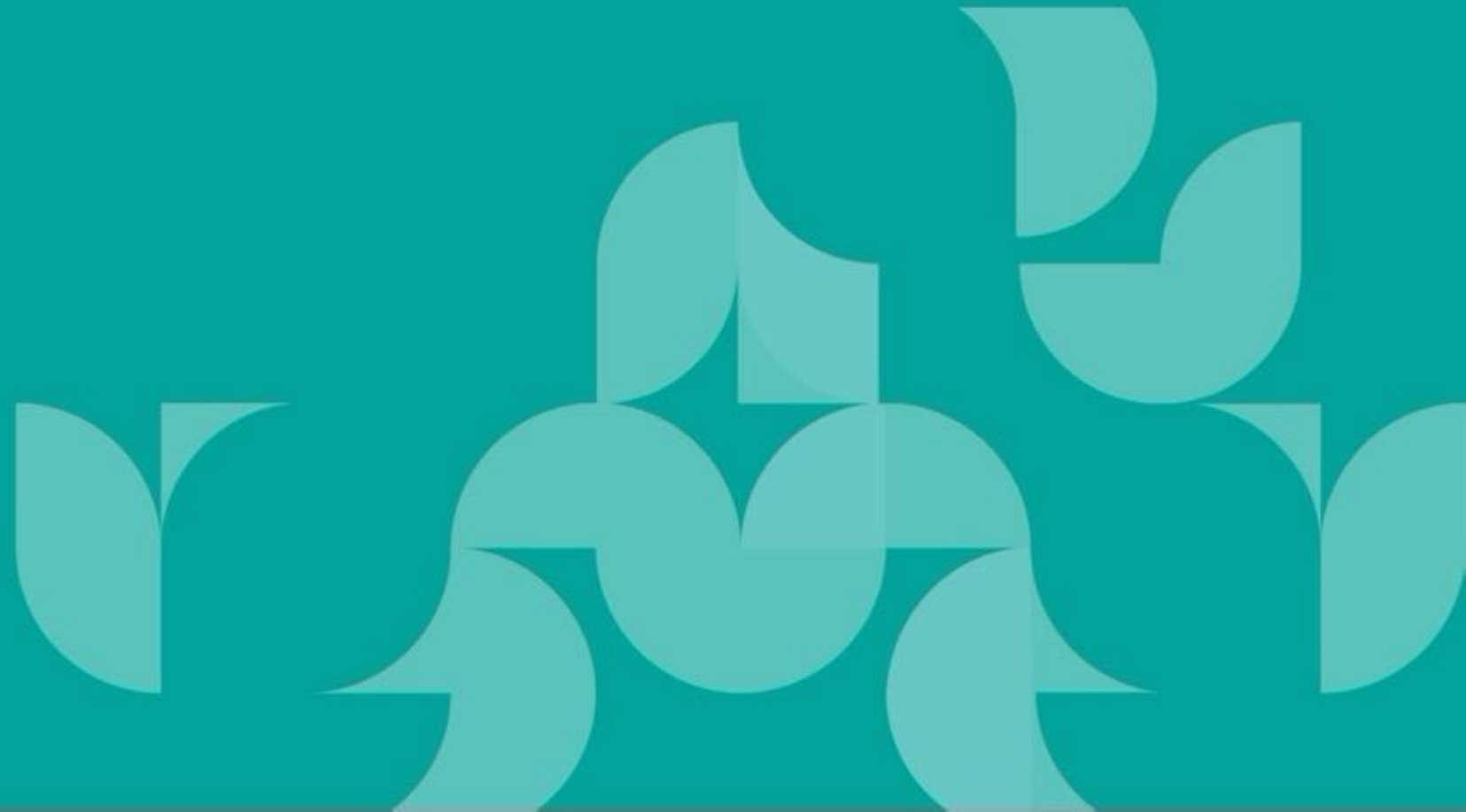
